

Bio: Bruce Gungle

Bruce Gungle is a 24 year resident of Tucson who moved here in 1984 to enroll in the masters program in Creative Writing at the University of Arizona. He has lived in the Tucson Mountain foothills since the fall of 1986, with the exception of a 2 year teaching stint in Japan from 1988-1990. After graduating with an MFA in 1990, Bruce took an active role in a wide array of community groups and an active interest in wilderness conservation issues. Bruce re-enrolled in the University in the mid-1990s, this time across campus in the hard sciences. In 2000 or 2001 he graduated with a Masters of Science degree in Atmospheric Science, and took a job as a Hydrologist with the United States Geological Survey, Arizona Water Science Center in Tucson, where he continues to work. Bruce was first appointed to the Pima County Planning and Zoning Commission in 1997, and is currently the Commission Chair.
